

Garboldisham Church Primary School PE and sports grant report 2016/17

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013 to 2016 to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring fenced and so can only be spent on provision of additional PE, physical activity and sports in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have the freedom to choose how they do this.

At Garboldisham Church Primary School we have decided to use the money to:

- Support and engage the least active children in physical activities
- Pay for professional development opportunities for all staff in PE and sport
- Increase pupils' participation in sport by using the money to pay for transport. This has been a significant barrier to our engagement with activities at district level in the past and the money will ensure we can attend more tournaments and sports events organised by the cluster.
- Improve resources to support development of the subject.
- Expand the number of sports afterschool clubs.
- Improve the large playground equipment to encourage more use at playtimes.
- Replenish the small playground equipment to encourage more use at playtimes
- Introduce 'Move a Mile a Day', no cost but could be supported with stopwatches and certificates or stickers for completion.
